### TIPS ON GROWING ORCHIDS Orchid of the Month: Bletilla species and hybrids

Not everyone knows there are a group of orchids that can be used as landscape plants in our region. Bletilla species and hybrids are completely cold hardy in our area. The only requirements Bletillas have is well drained soil and partial shade. Make sure you keep them out of midday sun and you should be rewarded with blooms every spring. This group of plants is propagated by underground bulbs that go dormant during the winter and develop new growth in the spring. Individual bulbs planted in the garden quickly grow into large clumps in just a couple of years.

There are three general color forms: various shades of purple (Bletilla striata and it's related hybrids), white (Bletilla striata alba), and yellow (Bletilla ochracea). Flowers are extremely fragrant, up to 2 inches across and 6-8 flowers on an semi-erect inflorescence.
